LEA: Why not? If I had known (know) that, I wouldn't have asked you.

PIT: I'll tell you why. If you watch (watch) that film, you will cry all the time; it's so sad, and I don't like to see you crying. If I didn't mind seeing you crying, I would go (go) with you.

LEA: Well, what else can we do then? How about another film? If there was (be) another film which was not so sad, would you watch (watch) it with me?

PIT: Of course. But there is none. If they showed another one, I would know (know) about it.

LEA: It seems to me it would have been (be) better if we had stayed at home.

PIT: Okay, let's go home then. Bye, Lea.

LEA: Bye, Pit. If you want to meet me again, you will have to (have to) have a good idea!

tenses

When Americans think (think) of Abraham Lincoln, they see (see) him as one of the greatest leaders in the history of their country. If Lincoln were not (not be) liked so much by Americans, they would not visit (not visit) the Lincoln Memorial by the thousands every year. Americans would not put (not put) his likeness on their money and their stamps if he had not done (not do) so many important things. If Lincoln had been (be) born into another family, he would perhaps have had (perhaps have) an easier start into life. He could have gone (can go) to school longer if more and better schools had existed (exist). Lincoln would not have become (not become) a famous and respected lawyer if he had not worked (not work) hard throughout his life. As a lawyer, he used to say to people who were seeking his advice: 'I will only defend (only defend) you in court if your case is (be) really right and just!' If the northern states had not already abolished (not already abolish [nicht bereits abgeschafft]) slavery [Sklaverei], the Civil War would not have happened (not happen). In addition, the war could have been (can be) avoided if the Southern states had not separated (not separate) from the North. When Lincoln's friends asked (ask) him about ending the war, he used (use) to say: 'I will have to (must) accept slavery in the South, if only the nation can be (can be) united again!'
